With such natural and agricultural wealth, it is no wonder that the cuisine of Colombia is becoming increasingly sophisticated. The devotion of Colombians to night life and the constant search for new entertainment have resulted in a proliferation of good and varied restaurants.

The capital cities of the departments pride themselves on opening new bars and restaurants that offer new food and beverages based on local and foreign ingredients. Smaller cities are faithful to their ancestral traditions and offer succulent typical dishes in small restaurants managed by their owners.



NIGHTS FOR FUN

When it comes to having fun, Colombia has something for every preference. Restaurants, Pubs, Casinos and discos offer a variety of nightlife options. Ethnic diversity allows native and foreign rhythms to coexist and mix.

In recent years, several of our artists have gained international renown. Shakira, Juanes, Carlos Vives, Cajas, and Fonseca enliven nights for foreigners and Colombians alike.



SHOPPING

Tourist destinations possess large shopping areas and centers where national and international brands are offered at very reasonable prices. Products manufactured in Colombia are of excellent quality, especially in fashion and clothing, two fields in which the country is playing an increasing role in the international arena.

HISTORY AND CULTURE

The Colombian territory preserves evidence of ancestral pre-Columbian cultures, important colonial foundations, and two centuries of republican history. Signs of racial and cultural mixing can be seen in every region. Popular traditions are expressed in the various accents, customs, gastronomy, and landscapes of the regions.

NATURAL PARKS AND RESERVES

Colombia has 53 protected areas of different categories within its system of national natural parks. Total extension surpasses nine million hectares.

With 9% of the country's area, the national park system is one of the largest in the world in relation to the size of the country.

Colombia constitutes an exceptional case in terms of biodiversity: it occupies first place in birds, orchids, and palm trees; second place in plants and amphibians; and third in reptiles. It concentrates 10% of the world's biota in less than 1% of the world's territory!

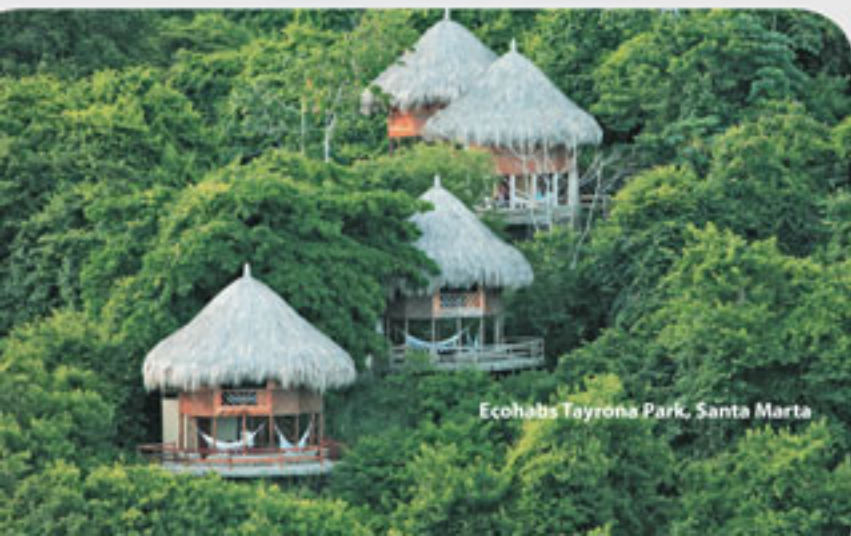
Colombia's natural parks are home to many ethnic Indian groups that have occupied their territory for centuries. Nowadays, 87 of the 300 or so indigenous groups that existed in the time of the Spanish conquest still remain.

The surviving tribes are protected by special laws that confer them the autonomous management of several affairs, yet compel them to contribute actively to the preservation of the wild flora and fauna in the ecosystems that support them.

ADVENTURE TOURISM

Colombia is divided into five natural regions: Andean, Caribbean, Pacific, Orinoquia and Amazonia, each of which offers very different environments for adventure tourism.

The high peaks and steep slopes of the Andes Mountains are ideal for rock climbing, hiking, and mountain biking. In several places, it is also possible to explore caves and go canyoning.

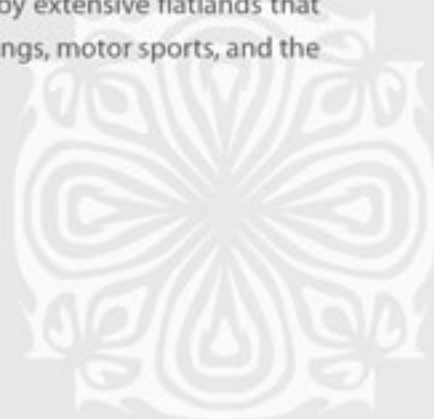
The strong winds generated the whole year by steep slopes allow the practice of delta wing and paragliding. And the slopes generate rapids and waterfalls that are just right for wet rappelling and kayaking.

All sorts of water sports may be practiced in the Caribbean Sea: sailing, windsurfing, and kayaking, for instance. Additionally, lovers of diving will find a large variety of marine flora and fauna, some of the longest coral reefs in the world, and the remains of sunken ships.

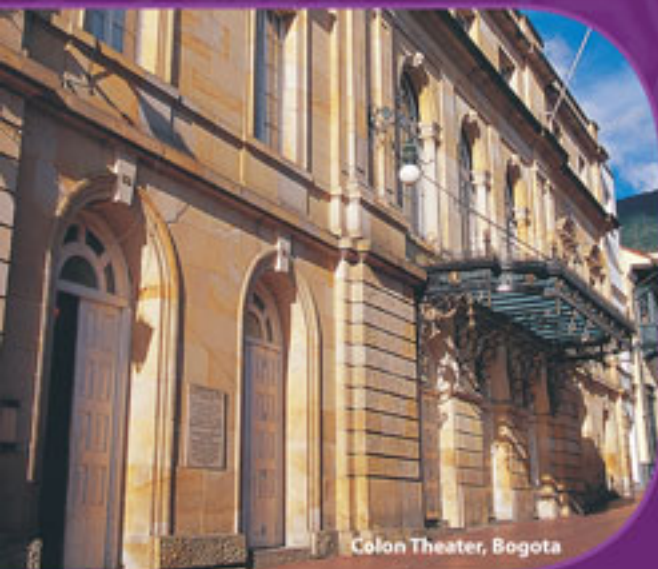
In southeastern Colombia, the Pacific region is a privileged spot for sports fishing. An infinite number of species inhabit the depths of its waters, embedded in a rich topography of valleys and vertical walls.

Towards the end of the year, when the water in the northern hemisphere becomes too cold, it is possible to witness one of the most beautiful sights nature can offer: the arrival of the humpbacked whales in search of warm waters for giving birth to their young.

The Pacific coast and the Amazon and Orinoquia regions are the most virgin areas in the Colombian geography. Rainforests predominate in the Pacific and Amazon regions, while the Orinoquia region is characterized by extensive flatlands that lend themselves to beautiful crossings, motor sports, and the navigation of imposing rivers.

The Colombian capital, with close to eight million inhabitants, is a modern, cosmopolitan city that has become one of the main industrial, trade and business hubs on the continent.

Once capital of the Vice-Royalty of Nueva Granada, Bogota preserves its narrow streets, large colonial and republican houses, temples, museums, and theaters in the historic and institutional center of La Candelaria district and its surroundings.

Several of the old buildings have been adapted to become hotels, restaurants, bars and cafes, allowing visitors to be exposed to history in a bohemian and cultural environment.



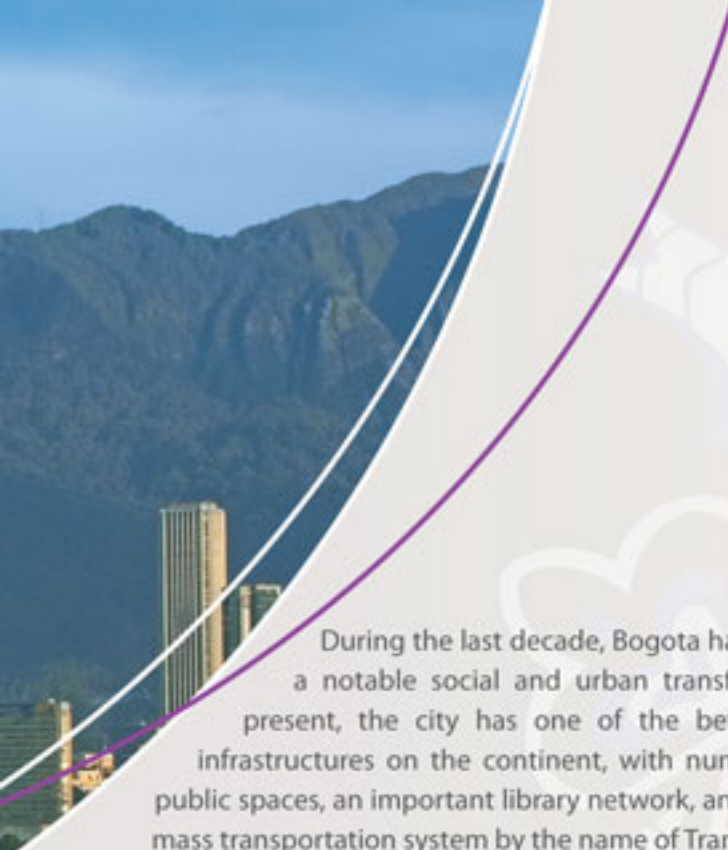

The city has over forty museums, several of which are known internationally. The Gold Museum is one of them, with the world's largest metalwork collection of 36,000 pre-Columbian pieces. The Museo Nacional houses works of art from various periods.

Cultural activities extend to theater halls. The Ibero-American Theater Festival, one of the largest in the world, takes place in Bogotá every other year. The city also offers music festivals, opera, zarzuela, and bullfighting seasons.



During the last decade, Bogotá has undergone a notable social and urban transformation. At present, the city has one of the better-designed infrastructures on the continent, with numerous parks, public spaces, an important library network, and an efficient mass transportation system by the name of Transmilenio.

Concerning spaces for events, Bogotá has several large convention centers, an important fairground, and a variety of meeting rooms. The hotel offer is wide and renders splendid services.

Shopping centers offer high-quality products at good prices. Nightlife is lively and varied, with bars and discos to suit all tastes. In addition, Bogotá prides itself on offering one of the best cuisines in Latin America.

The surrounding areas offer visits to flower exporting plantations, sacred lakes, and charming villages like Zipaquirá, with its famous Salt Cathedral, carved in an old salt mine. It is also possible to visit over thirty golf courses, all blessed by ideal weather practically 365 days a year.

ACCESS ROUTES

Bogotá may be reached by land and by air. El Dorado International Airport, less than 7 miles from downtown, welcomes over 300 international flights a day in its main terminal and 600 national flights between the main terminal and the Puente Aéreo, a secondary terminal for the exclusive use of the Avianca airline.

The city is connected to other capital cities and other regions in the country by a good network of trunk and secondary roads.

There are 4 main road entrances to the city: The autopista Norte that connects the northern and Eastern regions to the capital; the autopista Sur that connects the southern and western regions to the city; the autopista Medellin which is the route from the second largest city in the country and an alternative route from the Caribbean coast; and the entrance from the Llanos Orientales, the southeastern end of the country.

CORFERIAS

CARTAGENA DE INDIAS

GENERAL INFORMATION

Cartagena de Indias was founded in 1533 by Pedro de Heredia and soon became the greatest military base in Spanish America. For centuries, the walled city defended itself from its European enemy powers, France and England, who coveted the gold of the Spanish Crown.

Cartagena de Indias was the first city in Colombia to declare its independence from Spain, in November 1811. It was also the first city to suffer the scourge of the Spanish troops when they attempted a second conquest in 1815. The city valiantly withstood the enemy's attacks and soon after became known as "La Heroica" (the heroic city).

Cartagena de Indias has done a beautiful job of preserving its historic center, with its colonial mansions, colorful balconies, and narrow streets that lead to lovely plazas planted with trees; its colonial churches; and old cloisters that have been recently converted into luxury hotels. The old wall is also preserved, as well as the castles and fortresses that defended the bay.

Outside the Corralito de Piedra, (the little stone corral), as the colonial city is lovingly called, is a modern, vibrant city that offers comfortable hotels, restaurants, and shopping areas to its visitors.

One of the largest convention centers in Colombia is located in Cartagena de Indias: the Cartagena de Indias Conventions & Visitors Center, which can host events for up to 6,000 people.

The city offers excellent bathing spots at Bocachica, Punta Baru, Punta Canoas, and Tierrabomba. An hour by boat from the Bay of Cartagena, in the midst of warm waters and coral banks, is the archipelago of the islands of Rosario and San Bernardo. This is a beautiful seascape and landscape of white-sanded beaches that is truly ideal for diving and water sports.

MEDELLIN

GENERAL INFORMATION

Medellin is the capital of the department of Antioquia and Colombia's second city. It is located in the northwest of the country in the Aburra valley. The city and its metropolitan area have a population of 3,204,471 inhabitants, the equivalent of 12% of the total population of the country.

At present, it prides itself on being one of the most dynamic and entrepreneurial cities in South America. Its solid, diversified economy has allowed it to become an important industrial, trade, and financial hub.

The city possesses the best public utilities infrastructure in the entire country and modern settings for all kinds of events.

Recent city administrations have been intent on improving the living conditions of the citizens by developing high-impact projects such as the construction of a metropolitan rail transportation system; the Metrocable, a cable car system; and a generous network of libraries and public institutions centered on technical training.

As a consequence of implementing these projects, the city has become an outstanding example of urban and social renewal and an interesting destination for international visitors.

Medellin is also a favorite shopping destination. Stores, shops, and shopping centers offer excellent products at very good prices.

ACCESS ROUTES

The Jose Maria Cordova International Airport is located in the municipality of Rionegro, only an hour away from Medellin. The old Enrique Olaya Herrera Airport is located in the center of the city and operates as a domestic terminal accepting smaller flights coming from all over the country.

PLAZA MAYOR EXHIBITIONS AND CONVENTIONS CENTER

Two settings for important events are located in Plaza Mayor: the Palacio de Exposiciones (exhibit palace) and a large convention center.

CLIMATE

Thanks to its location, practically on the equatorial line, Colombia's tropical climate is equally pleasant the year round. Temperature changes are determined by altitude above sea level – the higher the altitude, the lower the temperature.

The seasons have to do with rainfall, and are bimodal. There are two rainy seasons: the first one, from April to June; the second one, from September to November. Likewise, there are two dry seasons: one from November to March; the other, from July to August.

Luminosity is constant throughout the year, with an equal duration of days and nights.

CONNECTIVITY AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Due to its privileged location, Colombia has become one of the main entrance gates to the American continent. It has eight international airports and thirty airports for domestic flights.

International airports welcome over 450 flights a week from the main cities on the American continent, the Caribbean, and Europe. Domestic flight terminals handle more than 1,600 flights per week, thus guaranteeing connections between all cities in the country.

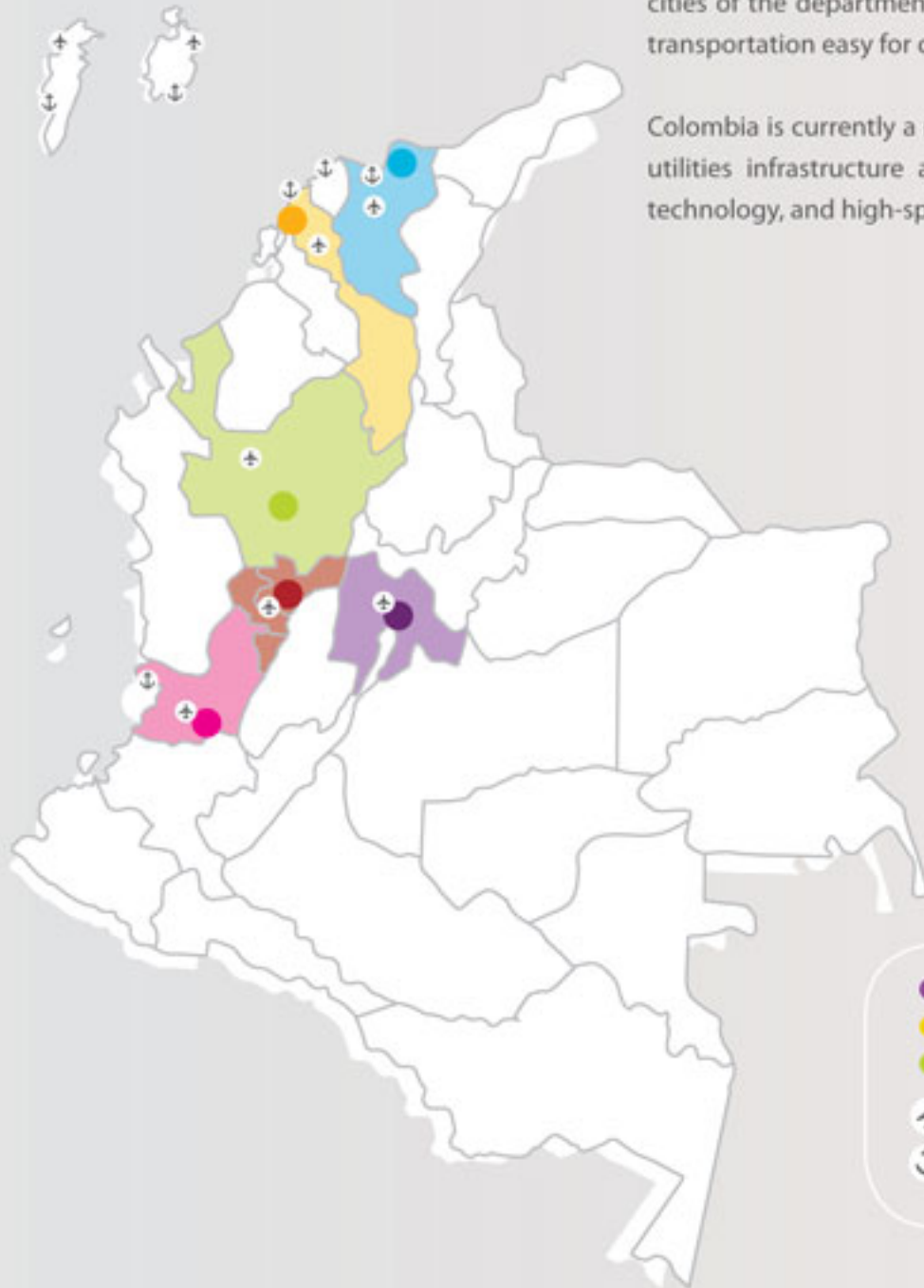

Attracted by the growth perspectives of the sector, others have recently arrived in the main cities with large investments and competitive rates. National hotel chains have not remained behind and compete with international ones in all categories with excellent quality standards.

Colombia offers accommodation options for all tastes and interests. Hotel options vary according to the geographic, climatic, and cultural features of each place: ample, traditional, luxury hotels in the downtown areas of cities; modern business hotels near the main airports or the financial areas; small, friendly boutique hotels; traditional haciendas adapted to take in tourists or convention groups; tourist inns managed by forest rangers; and traditional Indian Malokas (communal dwellings) in the green of the jungle or near the blue of the sea.

However, everyone will find a constant in the midst of all this diversity: the kindness, warmth, and passion of Colombians when it comes to taking care of your needs.
